StepBridge held the inaugural Club Pairs Championship during the month of August. Red masterpoints were awarded to the top half of each session as well as the top half for those who qualify for the championship. There were three categories in the Pairs of Open, Restricted (under 300 masterpoints) and Novice (100 masterpoints) players, as well as Open Individual. For the Restricted and Novice categories, the cut-off for eligibility was as of 31 July 2021.

There were 624 participants overall with 48 players competing for the Open Individual title, 77 pairs playing in the Open Pairs, 57 pairs competing in the Restricted Pairs and 42 pairs playing in the Novice Pairs. Played over four sessions in August, the results are:

# SARAH'S CHILLI HOT CHOCOLATE WITH MAPLE SYRUP

Mmm what a delicious winter treat – chilli hot chocolate with maple cream is sure to warm you up! Preparation time 10 mins and cook time 5 mins Serves 4

Chocolate and chilli go together incredibly well, the fiery heat of the chilli effortlessly cutting through the rich creamy chocolate. This chilli hot chocolate recipe isn't too spicy, but if you're not such a fan of chilli you can just add a little and taste, adding more if you're up to it. Do try it with the chilli though, it really does elevate the flavour of this drink to something very special!



## **INGREDIENTS**

1 fresh red chilli or ½ teaspoon dried chilli

1 quantity of chocolate ganache made from 400 grams roughly chopped dark chocolate and 1 cup of cream – served at liquid consistency

500ml milk or nut milk such as almond or macadamia

1 cinnamon stick

2 or 3 star anise

½ cup of cream

2 tablespoons maple syrup

Grated chocolate and chilli flakes (optional) to serve

## **BASIC GANACHE METHOD**

- Place chopped chocolate in a bowl
- Gently heat the cream in a saucepan until near boiling
- Pour the hot cream over the chocolate
- Allow to stand for a minute and then stir until smooth, dark and glossy. Allow to cool

### INSTRUCTIONS

- Remove seeds from chilli and slice into strips
- Combine the ganache, milk, cinnamon stick, star anise and chilli strips in a medium saucepan and warm gently until almost boiling
- Strain into a serving jug and pour the hot chocolate into mugs or glasses
- Whisk the cream and the maple syrup together until the mixture forms soft peaks
- Top each filled glass with a dollop of cream and sprinkle with the grated chocolate and a few flakes of chilli if desires
- Enjoy!




