Obituaries

VALE Titus Ling

Titus Ling passed away in November, He was 67 years old

I knew Titus Ling at Uni in South Africa in the early 1970's from Physics and Applied Maths classes, and then for a brief period where we both worked at Gold Fields of South Africa.

He did very complex work on mining simulations to predict deep level ground disturbances in gold mines. The Consultant who ran the service said Titus was the only person he knew who understood the thousands of complex equations. I played some bridge with him way back then socially. He then ran into visa problems and left to go to Australia.

I migrated to Australia in 1998 and retired to beautiful Port Stephens 8 years ago, where I had my first game of Duplicate Bridge ever. I was playing at my first ever conference at Maitland when I looked up at the scoreboard and saw the name Titus Ling at Table 1. Sure enough it was the same guy. We became close friends again, and he would come up to our place dozens of times for a few days. He loved the sunset drinks on the water and especially my wife Meryl's Beef vege soup which he would schlurp down for breakfast, lunch and dinner. We played bridge at Tomaree and Newcastle Bridge clubs. When I was in Sydney at my daughters place in St Ives he would pick me up and we would go have a game at Carlingford bridge Club mostly. I would close my eyes until we got to the club. He was one of the worst drivers I ever came across. He would be smiling playing his knockoff iPod with the same 20 love songs that never changed wherever he went.

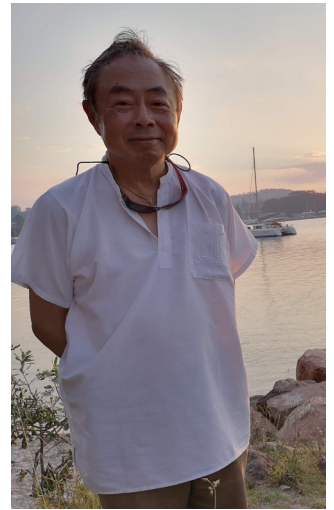
Titus did challenging real time computer programming when he came to Australia. He later on opened a coffee shop in Redfern where Russel Crowe was a customer. Unfortunately he got bowel cancer about 10 years ago, lost everything and became a disability pensioner. He had money to play bridge and eat instant noodles. Over the past 3 years his cancer spread and the ability to play on StepBridge was a huge plus for him.

When he came to visit he would lecture me for hours about coffee and how bad my coffee was, but that never stopped him from drinking 5 cups in a sitting.

Titus was an enigma. In all the time I knew him I never once got a straight answer to a question. But he was a loyal friend with a great sense of humour, a genius bridge player and never once complained about the terrible pain he endured. Rest well my friend.

Director's Corner

Why do we have System Cards?

If you read November's Director's Corner, you will know the answer! System Cards provide information to your Opponents; they are not for you and your Partner. The spirit of Bridge is that you fully disclose things to your Opponents — 'secret' communication with your Partner by any means is against the Laws of Bridge. A System Card is the basic description of the bidding system you are using and the card signals you are playing with a particular Partner.



Your Opponents are entitled to rely on whatever is in your System Card. You are required to follow what your System Card says (within reasonable judgement). Your Partner is required to have a systemically identical System Card.

Whilst the System Card is for your Opponents, having a proper System Card that has been discussed in detail with Partner is one of the better ways of establishing a new partnership, so it has benefits for the home side as well.

StepBridge provides several default System Cards that you can use or modify to the particular system you are using with your Partner. It also provides a simple mechanism to copy someone else's card: just look at their card by clicking on their name at the table, and there is an option to copy the card at the bottom of the window. If you have a new partner and you agree to play "their system" it is important to copy their card so that your Opponents are not confused about what system you are playing (even though you might be so confused).

What if you are playing Weak-2s with a new Partner, but your (old?) System Card still says you are playing Multi-2D? You open 2D (natural weak Diamonds), left-hand opponent checks your card, decides to Pass (as your Partner is required to bid and you have obviously forgotten to alert), and is then surprised when 2D is passed out. The TD is called! It is likely too late for bids to be changed so the contract will be 2D. Whatever the result, however, things will not improve for you: if the Opponents have been damaged by, for example, not finding a Major fit the TD will adjust the score accordingly — at best you will get the result at the table if you actually got a bad score!

In general doing something different to what is on your System Card can only make your score worse in any dispute. The TD may also use the card to resolve any disputes at the table as to the meaning of any bid, so if you or your Partner has explained a bid as something else, that will be treated as Misinformation (Law 21B3) even if both of you agree "the card is wrong"!

If you suspect Misinformation from your Opponents, it is best to call the TD as soon as possible. If your Partner has not yet bid, the TD will usually be able to resolve the misinformation, allowing you to correct any bid you made. This is preferable to a subsequent adjustment (which is intended to correct any damage rather than "punish" the irregularity) as it will produce an actual result at the table rather than a TD's assessment of what the likely result would be.

Director's Corner cont.

Finally, players are, of course, allowed to make mistakes. Mistaken bids are just mistakes and there is no adjustment whether the mistake causes damage or not. Mistaken explanations, however, are a Misinformaton irregularity from which your Opponents are entitled to relief if damage is caused. Players are sometimes frustrated by the difference between these two kinds of mistake, and the fact that the Opponents are not penalized if no damage is caused.

At the start of each session then, it is a good idea to check that the System Card you are showing is:

1. The correct card for today's system and Partner; and
2. Systemically identical to the card Partner is showing.

If not, do something about it. The TD will always be willing to assist

Recipe Book

Bacon Wrapped Stuffed Chicken Breasts

- 3 boneless chicken breasts
- Teaspoon of lemon pepper seasoning (or garlic and lime juice)
- 3 slices of tasty cheese
- 6 spears of asparagus
- 9 rashers of bacon
- 12 wooden toothpicks

Pat chicken breasts dry with paper towels. Slice horizontally through the middle, beginning at the thickest part, being careful not to cut all the way through. Open up and spread them out like an open book.



Season both sides with lemon pepper seasoning. Place one slice of cheese on each breast. Cut asparagus spears in half and place 4 halves on top of the cheese.

Roll the chicken up and over the cheese and asparagus, keeping the stuffing inside each roll.

Wrap each chicken breast with 3 pieces of bacon, using wooden toothpicks to secure the bacon, where it overlaps.

Place in the air fryer basket and cook for 15 minutes, turn and cook for 15 minutes more.

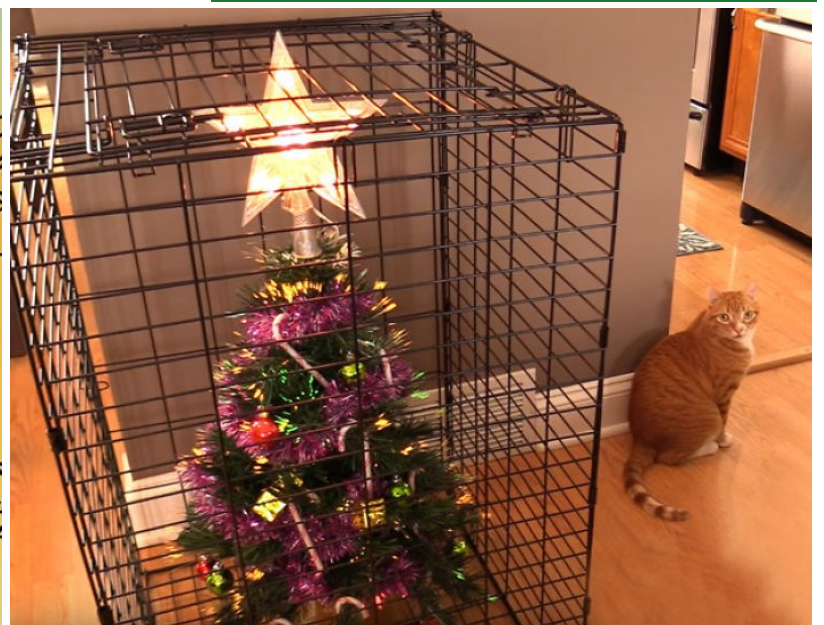
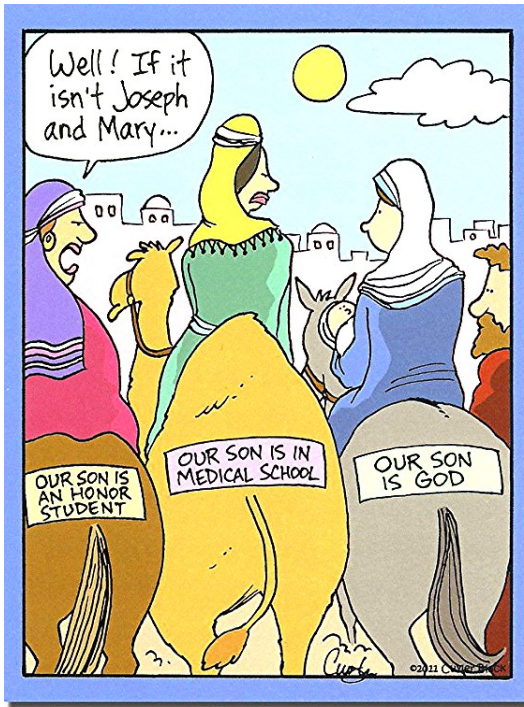
