StepBridge Australia is an internet bridge club based in Australia. The club has been in existence for more than 15 years and is affiliated with the Australian Bridge Federation and South Australian Bridge Federation. StepBridge Australia offers a bridge platform in a friendly and controlled environment. The benefit of our club is the ability to play from the comfort of your own home, or on holidays or abroad.

Since 2020, due to COVID-19 pandemic, the club has grown from 100 members to well over 2,000 members, most of which enjoy the \$10 Associate Membership so they can retain their current Home Club Membership. Sessions are conducted for Novice, Restricted and Open players with a range of times throughout the day.

For other clubs who wish to offer sessions exclusively for their members, StepBridge has a Virtual Club facility which is available at very little cost. This is a facility which helps our Virtual Clubs to increase their session exposure to their members.

StepBridge has a philosophy of wanting to give back to the bridge community, as well as the wider community. In addition to providing inexpensive club rooms, StepBridge has already done this by becoming the sponsor of the Gold Coast Congress Open Teams, which it hopes to be involved with for many more years to come.

On Thursday 19 May, StepBridge held a special fundraising day to support the people of Ukraine. All table fees from the day, of all Red Point Sessions, were matched by StepBridge Australia from club funds, and together with separate donations made by members were donated to the UNHCR to assist in the Ukraine Emergency. Total funds raised and donated for this important cause was just over \$5,000.

Following the ABF announcement that their Sunday Nationwide Pairs would cease at the end of May and subsequent feedback from players, June will see the start of a new weekly Sunday Afternoon Red Point session on StepBridge Australia called All Around Australia. This session each week begins at 2,30pm AEST, and consists of 27 boards. There are three separate fields of Open, Restricted & Novice available, with the masterpoint cut-off for the Restricted & Novice fields being as at the end of the previous month. Cost for the session is 75 Participation Points per player (approximately \$5). StepBridge welcomes anyone who is looking for a regular Sunday Afternoon online bridge session.

Cookery Corner

Chicken Pie

Ingredients

2-3 Chicken Fillets, diced
375ml can of Evaporated Milk
1 cup of Chicken Stock
3 tablespoons of Butter
3 tablespoons of Plain Flour
1 cup of Frozen Peas
1 large Carrot, diced
1 cup of mushrooms (optional)
1 medium Onion, diced



Directions

Puff Pastry Sheets

- 1. Cook chicken and set aside.
- 2. Grease pie dish and line with a pastry sheet.
- 3. Simmer onions, carrots and peas in the chicken stock for 10 minutes.
- 4. Drain veggies but keep the stock you drain.
- 5. Melt butter in saucepan, add flour and combine.
- 6. Gradually add the carnation milk and the drained chicken stock.
- 7. Brind to the boil, and once boiled reduce the heat, and simmer for 2-3 minutes.
- 8. Stir in the veggies and cooked chicken.
- 9. Add to the pie dish and cover top with another pastry sheet, and use either milk or butter to brush over top.
- 10. Cook for 1 hour at 180c

Holiday Blogs

Turkey

I have been in love with Turkey and its people for more than 10 years and this is my 3rd visit to Turkey. I can't say the language has become any easier to understand and it can be quite isolating when in a large group of people. This old blonde brain is struggling. I have my phone or IPAD at the ready for translation of, or for correction of pronunciation of impossibly sounding words. Let's see how long it is before I can have a conversation without faltering. A whole new appreciation of folks coming to Australia where English is not their native language.

I arrived in Istanbul in the middle of April. Istanbul is amazingly enthralling. After 2 weeks, we relocated to Düzce, a 2 ½ hours drive from Istanbul. Life is now in a picturesque rural setting less than 10 minutes from town. The location is within a basin with snow capped mountains surrounding us. The area is renowned for growing Findik (hazelnuts) and there are trees everywhere you look. With summer in full swing so is the planting season and farmers are seen sowing their crops. All around us they are planting rice. There are ancient half pipe irrigation systems about 1 metre above the ground. They access an artesian water supply and are used to provide irrigation for the crops.

I have to say after the years of living in Tasmania with the lush pastures and fantastic cattle both dairy and beef, to see the scrawny bony creatures here that graze the roadsides every day make me wonder how they produce any milk at all. Driving the country lanes is always a wonder, will I see a camel laden with provisions or a farmer driving an ancient cart pulled by a pony or a donkey. Yesterday I saw such a cart and on the back of it there was an old garden umbrella mounted to provide shelter from the sun. They were selling (karpuz) watermelons door to door.

With inflation running at greater than 34% you can only imagine how hard it is for the average family to survive. Rural families all have comprehensive vegetable gardens. If you have to buy anything that is imported you can expect to pay more than in Australia for the same product. To give you some perspective, the average monthly pension here is between 2500TL and 4000TL or \$250 to \$400 a month.

We are less than 30 kilometres from The Black Sea and the climate is subtropical in summer and has experienced a minimum temperature of -20.5C in winter. Not looking forward to that so much. I believe in winter we are likely to have snow on the ground for 2 months.

In 1999 this area was devastated by an earthquake killing 845 people and injuring over 5000 people. When I look around me at the ancient environment where everything from 5 years old to more than 2000 years old looks decrepit and about to fall down, I have to wonder how anything is still standing at all. I am enthralled by the history of this place, first settlements go back to 3rd century B.C. History shows that this region has been conquered by a succession of



marauders. The ancient relics of the past are fascinating. By the late 19th century Düzce was part of the Kastamonu Vilayet of the Ottoman Empire. Today it is an important industrial city to Turkey as well as for its agriculture. There are some Roman ruins of an ancient outdoor theatre and there are productions carried out there for tourists from time to time by local theatre companies.

Darwin was never 'on my bucket list' but with Covid, potential travel restrictions if caught overseas, I decided to spend two weeks here. In a word it has been great with many places of interest to visit

The highlight so far has been the Offroad Dreaming 'Litchfield National Park Day Tour with Waterfalls and crocodile jumping cruise' tour.

Firstly, we were taken to three fresh water pools of which we were able to swim in two. The third is currently off-limits because of a crocodile.

The water for these pools comes from underground springs and flows into the pools from waterfalls. The water is very refreshing. Apparently it is also very good for one's hair, but having none, I cannot comment.






The tour is all day with lunch and if you were to visit Darwin and could only do one tour, this is my recommendation.




