If "Unauthorised Information" is ever used at StepBridge

This is the technical term we use when deciding if untoward behaviour may have occurred during a tournament. Fortunately for us at StepBridge an audit of our tournaments over a period of one year by renowned international authority on this topic, Richard Hammond*, has reassured us that minimal untoward behaviour has occurred during our Tournaments.

As members of StepBridge, we are all passionate about playing bridge online and competing in this challenging game. However, with the increased accessibility and popularity of online bridge comes the potential untoward behaviour. This is why the detection of untoward behaviour is so important at StepBridge, and although it is an unpleasant subject, it requires our ongoing attention. Please be assured at StepBridge, we are one step ahead of everything in regard to this issue.

Recently, we developed new software specifically to help find (apologies, let's be perhaps unkind and refer to the miniscule number possibly misbehaving as) cheaters. This software not only monitors suspicious behaviour, but also provides historical and statistical data that can be used to build a case against a cheater. It is super clever and we are proud of it. This is a significant step forward in our efforts to maintain the integrity of our game and to ensure that the results of our games are based on skill and strategy.

It's important to stress that building a case against a pair always involves the analysis of a lot of boards. You can never tell if something is wrong based on just one, or a few boards, even if it seems totally absurd what is happening. Everybody can be extremely lucky once in a while, and this does not justify calling someone out as a cheater. During an investigation we evaluate a lot of played boards. If someone is overall extremely lucky when doing absurd actions (considering all absurd actions, also the ones that did not end well), this strongly points in the direction of cheating.

It is also worth mentioning that our software, although it helps in finding cheaters and presenting statistical data about all the played boards of a specific pair, does not reach a verdict. The actual investigation of a potential cheating pair is always done by a human expert. This expert will evaluate the presented data, and will also do a manual review of a set of boards. Based on the findings of this expert, a verdict will be reached.

As mentioned, we also have some encouraging facts to share on this topic. At StepBridge, based on statistical analysis, it is certain that at our club, there is a lot less cheating going on than at any other major online bridge platform. This was acknowledged by Nicholas Hammond, when he had a look at the statistical data of StepBridge Australia and compared it to the data of all other major bridge platforms. Hammond reported, confirming our own statistical data potentially <1% of the players of StepBridge are using unauthorised information methods and frankly this is such a small incidence that it is difficult to measure.. It is a testament to the efforts of our community to promote fair play and to maintain the integrity of the game.

We must state that, it is important to emphasise that it is never okay to raise any suspicions about an opponent while playing. This type of behaviour is not only unfair (as it is impossible to defend yourself against such accusations), it can also ruin someone's reputation and cause significant damage to their enjoyment of the game. As mentioned, proving cheating is always based on a lot of boards, so rely on the detection software to detect cheating. If you do have strong suspicions about a pair, please send an e-mail to support@stepbridge.com.au so we can investigate it. This will confidentially reach our Unauthorised Information Expert (UIE). The UIE expert will examine the boards and run a statistical analysis of the suspected players to determine if there are patterns suggesting regular suspicious activity. If so, they will be investigated fully.

In conclusion, we would like to thank the developers of this new software for their contributions to our community. We are confident that at StepBridge our games are fair, competitive and enjoyable for all players.

Allow Systems on StepBridge

In our Restricted and Novice sessions our aim is to provide games of Bridge that can be easily understood by relatively inexperienced players. The bidding systems used should be relatively natural where, as they say, "a Spade means a Spade"! The ABF classifies such systems as **Green** or (for strong Club systems like Precision) **Blue**. In these systems a one level bid guarantees at least three (and probably four) cards in that suit, and 1NT is a balanced or semi-balanced hand. The one exception is that an opening 1♣ may contain only two clubs or, in the case of Precision, be a strong hand of 16+ points with any shape.

In our Open sessions we also allow systems that the ABF classifies as **Red**. Such systems are allowed to open one of a suit with a singleton or void in that suit, and they may vary the meaning of those bids according to position and/or vulnerablity. A specific example is the Montreal Relay 1. (http://montrealrelay.com/montreal/1CP.html) which the documentation asserts should be alerted with "may be a singleton and is semi-forcing". You may not use this in our Restricted or Novice sessions!

Opening bids from 2♣ through 3♠ that could be weak (and overcalls of one-suit openings) are also restricted: they must show at least four cards in a known suit otherwise they are classified as **Brown Sticker** and not allowed in any of our regular sessions. The main exception is the multi-2♦ that could be weak in either Major – this bid can also include any number of strong hand types, but it cannot include other weak options.

An example of a Brown Sticker convention that is disallowed is Myxomatosis Twos where 2 of a suit means a strong bid in that suit, or a weak bid in the suit above, or a weak bid in the other two suits. You need some experience and understanding to defend correctly against such bids, hence the name as it was designed to kill "bunnies" (inexperienced players). We do not allow such conventions outside of Congresses. By the way, you may not 'sneak' any weak part of such conventions in under the 2 exception above.

There are other "highly unusual methods" that international experts might use. The ABF classifies such systems as Yellow and they are essentially banned in Australia except in the latter stages of big tournaments, so you are unlikely to come across them.

If you have concerns about any system being used by your opponents, please let your TD know. They may be able to correct the issue at the time, adjust your score for any damage caused, or issue warnings and penalties. Or they may refer the issue to our Review Board for consideration. We are committed to keeping our games fair and friendly – please help us to do so by reporting your concerns.

Salmon Pasta

Ingredients

- 500g white fish
- 10 oz. salmon fillet (cut into cubes)
- 4 chopped tomatoes
- 3 chopped finely basil leaves
- · 2 cloves crushed garlic.
- ³/₄ cooking cream
- Salt and pepper
- · Spaghetti or pasta of your choice

Directions

- Cook pasta, while at the same time heat tablespoon oil in frypan.
- Add garlic and salmon for about 5 minutes till light brown.
- · Add the basil and tomatoes.
- · Simmer gently till all cooked to your liking.
- Drain the pasta, add the other ingredients and ¾ of cooking cream.

Chocolate Self Sauce Pudding

Ingredients and Directions - Base

- 2 ozs of butter
- ½ a cup of sugar
- 1 egg
- 1 cup of self-raising flour
- 2 dessert spoons of cocoa
- ½ a cup of milk
- 2 teaspoons of vanilla essence

Mix altogether and pour into greased sandwich tin.

Ingredients and Directions - Top

Mix together:

- ½ a cup of sugar
- 2 dessert spoons of cocoa
- 2 cups of boiling water

Pour over the top and bake for 40 minutes in a moderate oven.

Sarah's Turkish Adventures - continued

At the time of writing this it has been 135 hours since the deadly earthquakes that struck southern provinces in Türkiye and in the neighboring country of Syria. Currently the death toll has increased to more than 20.000 in Türkiye and more than 80,000 injured.. There has been widespread criticism of the Türkish government's rescue effort being described as being slow and inadequate. Fortunately 61 countries have sent more than 7000 personnel to assist with the rescue efforts The government of course says how could they prepare for such an eventuality occurring. There has been a declaration of a state of emergency in the affected provinces for the next 3 months. The TV coverage is harrowing and hard to watch at times. Intermittently a sprinkling of good news stories emerge with the rescue of some very lucky citizens. The race is on now to attempt to reach those still trapped and alive. The weather is extremely cold and many of the casualties are believed to have frozen to death in the extremely cold temperatures. Maximum temperatures in the area are hovering around 2C at best. Dropping to -6C overnight. Can you imagine the misery the survivors will continue to suffer. They have been informed by the government that they aim to build housing in a year for those left without a home in the 10 provinces affected. The current estimate is that more than 6,000 buildings have been damaged or destroyed. Add to this horrendous story that millions of neighbors in nearby Syria have already been forced to leave their homes and flee and now many more will be displaced to add to the already unprecedented rates of inflation and the current cost of living crisis the country is undergoing. These cities have no water or utilities, no food or resources. Many people whose apartment building appears to be intact are terrified to return to their homes. They have witnessed neighboring buildings crumble and fall like a pack of cards. This country has so many buildings that are thousands of years old and still standing. Yet buildings built in the modern era have not had to adhere to any building codes prior to 1999 earthquakes in the northern regions of Türkiye. I hope that our wonderful StepBridge players will support our Day for Türkiye and that collectively we can make a small difference to some very deserving people,

On the home front our house is finished sufficiently that we have moved in and enduring the winter, Fortunately the home is cosy and warm and it makes the view of the snow outside enjoyable, Orhan and I are caring for his Mum and spending the winter close to home.
