StepBridge Australia Club Championships

StepBridge will be holding its second annual Club Championships during the month of August. Red masterpoints will be awarded to the top half of each session as well as the top third for those who qualify for the championship. There will be the four categories of Open Pairs, Open Individual, Restricted Pairs (under 300 masterpoints) and Novice Pairs (100 masterpoints) played at the following times:

Wednesdays 2, 9, 16 & 23 August

Novice (under 100 masterpoints) - 4:10pm session

Restricted (under 300 masterpoints) - 7:45pm session

Open - 8:00pm session

Sundays 6, 13, 20 & 27 August

Open Individual - 10:00am session

For the Restricted and Novice categories, the cut-off for eligibility is as of 31 July 2023. The cost will be 100 PPs per person, per session.


To qualify for a category, you need to play at least 3 out of the 4 sessions. Your best 3 results will be combined and averaged. For the pairs session, you need to play with the same partner to qualify. The championship in each category will be awarded to the pair/individual with the highest average.

Prizes will be awarded to 1st, 2nd, and 3rd in each category:

1st = 2,500 PPs 2nd = 1,000 PPs 3rd = 500 PPs

Turkish Blog

Sarah's Turkish Adventures - continued

Kurban Bayram has come and gone. I survived it. Countless visitors and thousands of cups of tea and coffee. The sacrifice of the young bull was made. The meat was dispatched to the poor and needy.

I have been to more than 35 countries over the years. This must be the first place where you can buy food from a vendor near a square in Istanbul to encourage and feed the pigeons!!! As you can imagine it is a paradise for them and consequently thousands of pigeons frequent the square and surrounding park. Later we were travelling on a ferry across the Bosphorus Strait and there were seagulls hovering above us. We were sitting out on the open deck enjoying the view. Orhan commented on the seagulls hovering and how nice they were. Immediately he said this one pooped and of course it landed all over him!! Turks and their love of animals whether it be the street cats and dogs or the pigeons or scavenging seagulls always amazes me.

This week we have received 4 wedding invitations. I have been to more weddings in the past year than my whole life I think. As I have told you before, they generally are huge weddings, hundreds of people. The thought of 4 in a week is overwhelming. Yesterday a young woman appeared at the door. Yet another stranger for me to greet, meet and speak to with my very bad Turkish. She hands me an invitation and says I hope we will see you on Sunday. I am thinking oh no another wedding! Fortunately Orhan arrives home and he takes over the conversation with our visitor. She leaves, Orhan glances at the invitation and says we only need to go for an hour or so, it's no problem. I see the date and time are Sunday when I am most busiest with StepBridge directing. I will not be able to go. I then take a closer look at the invitation and I cant see the word wedding anywhere. The font is a complicated script and this makes translating even harder. I resort to my trusty google translator and take a photo of the invitation for translation. To my horror the translation reveals I am being invited to attend a Circumcision ceremony and celebration feast!!! Part of the invitation translates as: "Circumcision is the order of the Prophet Muhammad, This apostasy, which was given to me, let those who hear it hear, Those who want to achieve his reward, welcome this happy day, I kiss your hands I expect you to my circumcision."

I can't believe a woman I have never met, whose father had done some plumbing work on our house, has invited us to the circumcision of her son. I question Orhan in great detail as to how and why and what this is all about. I must have had a look of abject horror on my face. He is laughing at me. I ask him how old is this boy? He said, I don't know, probably somewhere between 5 and 10 years old!! I am then envisioning some ancient ritual, and demand full and frank disclosure of this barbaric practice. Orhan assures me it is carried out by a doctor under clinical conditions with the administration of local anaesthetics, short and sweet, done and dusted!! Now we all party and we have the requirement to gift100TL to the boy.

The weather has been glorious until this week, when we had 3 days of storms and torrential rain. I took photos of the canal in front of the house . The water level was almost to the top of the banks before the rain stopped.


Sarah's Turkish Adventures - continued

We spend most of our time on the terrace enjoying the flowers and the forest panorama. Meals and entertaining all al fresco. The squirrels have been a bit scarce. There is an abundance of nuts on the trees awaiting harvest so they are not so hungry.

Following the national elections and subsequent return of President Tayip Erdogan the inflation rate continues to climb and the currency exchange rate causes everything imported to become more expensive than ever. In April the exchange rate for Australian dollar was about \$1.0 = 12.50TL today \$1.00 = 17.32 TL. 38% increase in exchange rate is personally great for me but horrible for the local economic climate.

I have been perfecting my Turkish cooking skills. Thought i might share a recipe this month.

The typical Turkish diet consists of a huge ritualist breakfast - olives white cheeses, eggs, maybe sausage bread of course, honey jams, perhaps water melon and at this time of the year fresh cherries and copious cups of tea. Most meals serve soup all times of the year again bread and a variety of vegetable dishes and rice or pasta. Meat is almost non-existent due to the cost. With this in mind I thought I would share with you how to make Kuru Fasulye or Baked Beans. This dish would normally be served with Rice or Bulgar Wheat and slices of raw onion and plain yoghurt. Perfect making this dish and you will never open a can of beans again.

Kuru Fasulye (Baked Beans)

Ingredients:

- 500 grams of dried haricot beans
- 300 grams of ground beef
- 2 medium sized onions
- 1 tomato
- 3 red peppers
- 1 tablespoon of tomato paste
- 1 tablespoon of chilli paste
- Half a teaspoon of oil
- 1 teaspoon of salt
- 1 teaspoon paprika
- 1 teaspoon of black pepper



Method:

First of all, before cooking the dried beans, in order to prevent the dry beans from causing gas and bloating and causing discomfort, make sure to soak the dried beans the night before and add a pinch of salt or baking soda to the water you have soaked.

Then, after draining the water of the soaked beans, put them in a saucepan and add hot water to the level above the beans, cover the pot for about 10 minutes and leave it to boil.

In the meantime, add half a tea glass of oil in a separate pot, turn on the stove and after the oil heats up, add the ground beef into the pot and fry it.

After the meat has evaporated, add the chopped onions and red peppers into the pot and continue frying.

Then, after peeling the skin of the tomato and dicing it into cubes, add it to the pot and after the onions soften, add the tomato and pepper paste and fry until the smell of the tomato paste is gone.

In the meantime, drain the boiled beans and add them to the pot and fry for about 5 more minutes, then add salt and spices.

Finally, add hot water into the pot so that it is 3 inches above the dry beans and cook for about 30 minutes by closing the lid of the pot, then you can rest your meal for 10 minutes and serve it with rice pilaf, onion salad and tzatziki.

It was the familiar foursome at the table. That very 'Likeable LHO, my 'Marvellous Partner' and my nemesis the 'Resourceful RHO.' I had the sudden thought, if my hand is so good what are the other hands likely to be? I awaited the bids nervously and West was declarer.

LHO Pass Partner Pass RHO 2 Hearts The 2H was decl

The 2H was declared as being 'weak', with no mention of length but I assumed at least six hearts.

My mind cycled through the bidding options.

If RHO had not bid, I would have opened 2C.

But what now?

Double? What would the point be of doubling? What can I possibly expect to find of use in my partner's hand? Could my partner have the Ace of hearts? Well, not likely as RHO had bid hearts but not impossible, of course. If I do double, how can my partner give me any responses of use? They will not bid clubs or diamonds. Do I care if they have spades or hearts? Not really. Partner is likely to have hearts and spades and they are no use whatsoever!

I could bid 3D, but that is not a serious option because partner may leave me in it.

A NT bid would be 99% likely to bring an immense grin to the face of my RHO and confirmation that yes once again my nemesis had 'got me'.

They would open a nice wine that night to celebrate.

Bridge Hand

5D is pointless because unless the goddess of Bridge has structured the other hands to create mayhem with all the diamonds in one of the opponent's hands...hmmm is my RHO feeling confident and can I sense this over the internet?

Am I imagining things?

No one can say that a self preservation paranoia is not endemic in Duplicate Bridge!

So, there was only one logical bid to make and I took the plunge and bid 6D.

Predictably LHO led the 3 of hearts and dummy is displayed.

6D was the perfect bid. This time the bid to 6D prevented my resourceful RHO from stealing the contract in 4H because they also had two extremely useful hands. Here are all the hands.

Bridge Hand

EW could have easily got 4H if played correctly and they were vulnerable, for a score of 620. If they had overbid 6H and been doubled they would perhaps have only gone light for two tricks and minus 300. We were not vulnerable and would earn 920.

With a heart lead 6D is effortlessly secured. My RHO did stop us getting the top score of 940 because my LHO led a heart. If the RHO did not pre-empt with a 2H bid, LHO may lead a spade to the Ace in dummy.

I can assure you that the flow of dopamine increased when I saw the heart lead and the dummy go down with three diamonds and four clubs.

Bridge is a wonderful reaffirmation of letting your emotions take over when the right moment occurs and taking the benefits which that feeling of 'love at first sight' brings.

That is why we play this game?

Cookery Corner

Thank you to Brenda McClean (Brenda) for our monthly Cookery Corner.

Braised Steak and Onions

Ingredients

- 2/3 cup plain flour
- 1kg blade or casserole steak
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 3 brown onions, thinly sliced
- 400mls beef stock
- 250gms mushrooms, thickly sliced
- Mashed potatoes, carrots and peas to serve



Directions

- Combine 1/2 cup flour, and salt and pepper on a plate. Lightly coat each piece of steak in seasoned flour.
- Heat oil in a non-stick frying pan over medium-high heat. Cook steak, in batches, for 3 minutes each side or until browned. Transfer to an ovenproof dish.
- Preheat oven to 180°C. Add onions and mushrooms to the frying pan. Cook, stirring, for 4 minutes or until tender. Sprinkle remaining 2 tablespoons of flour over onions. Stir until well combined.
- Slowly add beef stock, stirring constantly. Bring mixture to the boil. Pour mixture over beef. Cover and bake for 2 hours or until steak is tender. Serve with creamy mashed potatoes, zucchini and green beans.

Puff Pastry Delights

Ingredients

- Puff Pastry Sheets
- Strawberry Jam (or other good strong jams, such as Rosella)

Directions

 Using Puff Pastry Sheets, spread Strawberry Jam thickly on and cut to preferred slice.



- Cook at about 180 for 20 minutes.
- Serve with custard or ice cream.
