This was the first StepBridge Congress that we used MyABF for the registration of players. We found out that a number of players had not yet registered with MyABF and therefore had some difficulties. Depending on the progression of our Teams software, we hope to incorporate Teams into our congress schedule next year. This will require some discussion with South Australia Bridge Federation for including Teams Congresses.

President's Message continued

In relation to our Teams software, there has been so much happening. At the time of publishing this newsletter, we have had 4 Teams session. Many thanks to Epko Steinmetz, Mark Hetherington and Sarah Zoral for their efforts to make the Teams possible. Also thank you to you, the players, who have been in a session and tried the new software. There are more improvements to happen, but we are slow getting there.

On the financial side, the new Committee is looking carefully at our income and expenses. I can confirm that TD and Administration expenses are increasing. Therefore we are considering if an increase of Participation Points (PPs) per session, which is currently 50PPs for Green Masterpoint sessions and 75PPs for Red Masterpoint sessions, is required or if our current surplus can cover these increases in expenses for the time being. If an increase is required, it will take effect of 1 January 2024. We will advise members ASAP if there will be a slight increase or not.

However, a decision has been made that we will increase our Home Club Membership Fee from \$30 to \$40. This is due to both the ABF (Australian Bridge Federation) and SABF (South Australia Bridge Federation) levies increasing for 2024 and the need to pass this onto our Home Club Members.

Therefore Membership Fees will be the following as of 1 January 2024.

- Home Club Membership: \$40
- Associate Membership: \$10

For those present at the AGM, a policy was approved that players over 90 years of age who have been members of StepBridge for over 3 years, will receive the following:

- Waive the yearly membership fee (for both Home & Associate members)
- Free games, in the form of free credit of participation points as required
- Refund any existing participation points they may have in their account

Congratulations to the following members who join with Kevin Kendell [KevinKen], our Life Member, in benefiting from this new policy.

VALE Tom Lyons (TomyLy)

27 October 1952 - 29 September 2023

We are sad to advise members and friends that Tom Lyons passed away after a long hard fought battle with cancer.

I will try to cater for both groups of players in future material that I write.



Cookery Corner

Thank you to Brenda McClean (Brenda) for our monthly Cookery Corner.

French Onion Beef Casserole

Ingredients

- 2 tbs olive oil
- 1kg Steak, cut into 3cm pieces
- 200g brown mushrooms, thickly sliced
- 1 brown onion, coarsely chopped
- 1 large carrot, peeled, coarsely chopped
- 2 celery sticks, coarsely chopped
- 1/4 cup (35g) plain flour
- 40g pkt French onion soup mix
- 1 1/2 cups (375ml) salt-reduced beef stock
- 4 thyme sprigs
- 50g garlic butter
- 6 potatoes, cut into 1cm-thick slices
- 1/2 cup (50g) shredded pizza cheese
- Thyme sprigs, extra, to serve

Directions

Place all the ingredients in the slow cooker, mixing the flour and soup mix with the stock. Set the slow cooker for 4-6 hours.

Ingredients - Caramelised onion

- 20g butter
- 2 brown onions, thickly sliced
- 1 garlic clove, crushed
- 1 tbs brown sugar
- 1 tbs balsamic vinegar
- 2 tbs salt-reduced beef stock
- 1 tsp thyme leaves

Directions - Caramelised onion

- Melt butter, together with onions and garlic. Then add the remaining ingredients and stir well.
- Add the Caramelised onion mixture to the slow cooker for the last half hour.



Cookery Corner

Raspberry & Strawberry Fool

Ingredients

- 200g raspberries
- 200g strawberries, stems removed, cut into quarters
- 30g granulated sugar
- 250ml heavy cream
- 4 tbs greek yoghurt
- 2 tbsp. sugar
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 10 each butter cookies, crumbled (I use shortbread)

Directions

- Toss the berries together with the sugar letting them marinate together for 15 minutes at room temperature.
- Using a chilled bowl, whip the heavy until light and fluffy, fold in the yoghurt, powdered sugar and vanilla until combined.
- Start layering the fools together between 6 glasses, starting with a layer of cream, followed by the mixed berries and cookie crumble.
- Repeat the layers until all the glasses are filled.
- Serve chilled.

Bridge Article

Playing the King

I have noticed a lot of players going up with king when declarer leads toward AQ.

I have questioned a couple of players about why they do that and they say "because they were going to finesse anyway so I am forcing up the ace.

If you examine this, you will see you are often promoting an extra winner for declarer.

If declarer has Jxx opposite AQx , playing King makes the jack good, but if declarer makes a successful finesse, there is still a losing jack.

The other consideration is that declarer might not be finessing and the king appearing is a bonus.

There are instances where playing the king is right:

If declarer is a strong player, and has already drawn trumps AND you want partner to lead towards your AQ for example, then he might be about to play the Ace and throw you in with the king to prevent that. If you play the king in this situation then the thrown is prevented. This situation is rare though and you need to assess how good declarer is.

There is a situation where going up with the K is right however: If declarer is leading towards AJT, for instance, AND you are very keen to get your partner on lead, if you are holding the Kx, it is often right to go up with K. The reasons for this are:

If declarer is allowed to finesse the J then your K will drop next time and the suit will be set up.

If declarer needs to keep your partner off lead, because you are holding a threatening position in another suit, then declarer may be about to go up with Ace and then throw you in. You prevent that by going up. *Larry Bryant (Larry)*

Are Those Europeans Different?

We play on StepBridge in the blissful state of not having to consider the physical cards on the table below us, something which does happen with F2F Bridge.

Have a look at this 24 HCP hand below. Do the cards look different?



But Europeans face a different picture when they play not only 'face-to-face' but also as it happens, in their version of StepBridge. Cards differ from country to country. In fact, if you change your settings to 'Dutch' (**warning - please do not do this!!**) you would face a different picture all together when you play in a StepBridge tournament. Dutch cards usually have the Jack as '*Boer*', the Queen as '*Vrouw*', the King as '*Heer*' and the Ace as '*Aas*'.

Spades is Schoppen, Hearts is Harten, Ruiten is Diamonds and Clubs is Klaveren.

Bridge is BIG in Europe. The French Bridge Federation alone (Fédération Française de Bridge) had pre-covid over 100,000 members. The Dutch Bridge Federation had 85,0000 members. These numbers indicate a widespread enjoyment of our favourite pastime.

But there is also a federation of smaller Bridge communities. Ones where the country is smaller and so the total numbers playing are smaller. It used pre-covid to be known as Federation of European Small Bridge Associations. I think recently they changed their name. They have an annual Congress rotating amongst members. In 2022 it was held in Larnaca, Cyprus and was won by Serbia. In 2021 despite all the troubles of the War that has been running since 2014, it was won by Ukraine, being held in Vilnius, Lithuania.

It seems a long time ago but pre-covid when in Luxembourg I contacted the 'Bridge Club de International Luxembourg' and was kindly hosted by their President for a delightful evening session of Bridge, partnering a very well-educated and talented individual. He was very pleasant and a very competent player, and as he spoke English, French, German and Luxembourgish he fortunately soon made any language barriers disappear! As Europe has a long summer holiday they closed completely during July and August for the Summer.

Then they had approximately 65 players but alas the numbers have shrunk considerably due to Covid. They link in with the neighbouring large Federations. Members also play routinely in Congresses in Belgium and France.

It was a delightful evening of Bridge. We played in a hotel equipped with a friendly barman. The Bridge was fun, and fortunately they used bidding boxes. The cards are French so their use of French made my schoolboy French suddenly become important again!

'Petit' for small. 'Le Roi' for the King. 'La Dame' for the Queen and 'Le Valet' for the Jack. Spades being 'Piques', Hearts being 'Coeurs', Diamonds being 'Carreuax' and Clubs being Trefles'. I made some finessing errors until I realised that I had been confusing Le Roi with Le Valet!

With one hand there was great excitement.

It is the one above with a delightful 24 HCP.



I bravely opened 3NT hoping my partner would understand. I did not want to miss out on a game score.

Imagine my delight when Marcus my polyglot 'Marvellous Partner' immediately responded 6NT preventing my nemesis, my Resourceful RHO from bidding, (even in the unlikely event that she had wanted to!).

He had 9 HCP and so as he laid his cards down on the table, he said *C'etait une navigation facile et simple pour votre partenaire'* ('it was an easy plain sailing for you partner').

I knew 6NT was going to be easy..... but I had to make certain that I did not confuse my *Le Roi* with *Le Valet*!

The Europeans are slightly different with their cards but exactly the same as us Down Under.

They like us, completely enjoy the sport of Bridge and friendships are easily made despite language differences.


Finding the Best Way
